Notes:

1. Natural increase is the difference between the number of live births and the number of deaths.
2. Residual net migration is calculated as population change minus the amount of natural increase.
3. Births and deaths are estimated for the most recent years due to a lag in reporting. The historical series may be revised in cases where more accurate data becomes available.
4. Migration trends may not be reliable for smaller counties or counties with characteristics that make them difficult to estimate accurately. Erratic gains and losses are often apparent. Using a three year rolling average might stabilize migration estimates for smaller counties and those showing erratic trends.
